## Launch

Thinking of all the places you've ever lived, who has been your most interesting neighbor? Describe.

## Explore

### Read the passage

Why is asking "Who is my neighbor?" the wrong question? What does asking that question expose about the person's heart?

Why did the priest and the Levite pass by the wounded man? What could have been some of their reasons for not helping him?

What did the Samaritan exhibit that the other two didn't?

Why does Jesus connect our relationship with God to being a good neighbor?

## Apply

"God is more concerned with action than knowledge." Why do most Christians spend more time learning the Bible than living the Bible?

A good neighbor: a) isn't paralyzed by differences, b) steps into people's pain, and c) disregards opinion polls. Which of these aspects of being a good neighbor is most difficult for you to live out? Why?

Who is one person in your life who really needs your compassion? What will you do this week to get off your donkey and help them?

Pray that we would be good neighbors, truly displaying the compassion of Christ in tangible ways to people who are different than us.
